

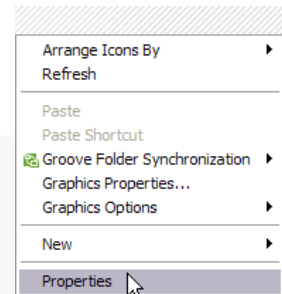


# CHANGE YOUR SCREEN RESOLUTION P.1

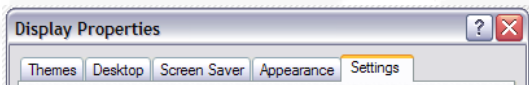
Screen resolution Refers to the sharpness and clarity of an image. The term is most often used to describe monitors, printers, and bit-mapped graphic images. You may need to change the screen resolution to make all items on the monitor larger and more visible. This is particularly useful if you have difficulty seeing. Screen resolution is dependent on the size of your monitor, some monitors do not support higher (smaller on the screen) resolutions.

## To change your screen resolution follow these steps:

1. From the Windows Desktop (Press Ctrl+D to minimize all windows and view the Windows Desktop) use the right mouse button to click on the desktop and then click Properties.



2. At the properties dialog box, click the Settings tab.



3. In the screen resolution section of the window, click and drag the marker until you have reached the size you would like to change your resolution to. In most cases this will be either 800x600 or 1024x768.



4. When you click OK, your screen may go black for a few seconds while the resolution is changed. Once the screen is visible again you will see how it looks with the new settings. If you like those settings and would like to keep them you must click Yes in the Monitor Settings dialog box (shown below). You have 15 seconds to do so. Clicking No will revert you back to your previous settings.
